> We are all called to love God and our Neighbor. Through our little ministry we try to help meet the material needs of our neighbor just as Jesus fed the hungry when He multiplied the loaves, but at the same time we also hope for the salvation of the souls of all those we serve. We do not judge but try to plant some seeds that will help them in both a material way and a spiritual wav.

It is always a struggle to keep this spirituality in our dealings with the sheer volume of calls we receive and oftentimes the anger, anxiety, and aggressiveness we see in those seeking assistance. This is what truly makes this little ministry a ministry, and not just a business, for the definition of a ministry is the act of serving. We truly serve, and unlike a business, we seek nothing in return.

Our journey on this earth is for a short time. May we make the very best of this time and persevere until the end. There is much work to be done. May we never tire of seeking to serve God's will and always keep His love at the root of our heart, our thoughts, and our deeds. At Christmas, Jesus came to be with us, and He still remains with us. His mom works at a local retail store but only made \$848 in the past month. They have to make multiple trips to Kansas City for their son's medical condition. (3238)

Please pray for S, a 36 mom with 3 children. She has been unemployed as she has broken her hand. She has no income and owes \$1364 on her Evergy bill and \$506 on her water bill. (3302)

Please pray for C, a 48 year old lady who lives by herself. C was involved in a car accident and currently is unable to work. She has no income and owes \$900 on her rent and over \$800 on her utilities. (2775)

Please pray for K, a 37 year old mom who lives with her 2 young children. K has had several medical issues including having surgery for cancer. She lost her job and is now working for Door Dash but only made \$399 in the past 4 weeks. She currently owes \$1400 on her rent and over \$600 on her utilities. (2841)

Please pray for S, a 41 year old mom with two children. S cleans houses for a living and barely makes enough to cover her rent payment. She owes \$2333 on her Evergy bill. (2847)

Please pray for N who is taking care of her husband who has stage 4 pancreatic cancer. They have four children ranging from 6 to 16 years old. They currently owe over \$2000 on their utility bills. (2871)

four young children. Her 9 month old daughter was born prematurely and is on a breathing machine. Her only source of income is the \$910 of social security income her 8 year old son gets as he is autistic. She currently owes over \$1000 on her evergy bill. (2870)

Please pray for B, a 30 year old mom with five young children. B has not worked for the past month and she owes \$630 on her water bill which has been disconnected. She has had no income in the past 30 days. (2895)

Please pray for J, a 45 year old lady who has been in treatment to overcome her addiction. She currently has no income and needed help to get into an Oxford House. (2913)



Our Mission

Our mission statement states that we help those who come to us in need regardless of race, ethnicity, religion or gender. The application process by phone clearly makes our service equally available to all those in need. We have set up our program to give special accessibility to all veterans, those who are homeless and suffering from mental illness and those who are living in homes with utilities currently disconnected. We feel these are the most vulnerable and try to attend to these as quickly as we can.

We allow social workers from the VA to submit an application directly via email and try to contact the veteran as soon as we can to provide assistance. In addition we accept applications directly from the Mental Health Association, Comcare and the Wichita Police Department HOT Team who are working with clients who suffer from mental illness and are currently homeless to help them to move into an apartment which is a much safer environment than being out on the streets. We allow those with utilities that have been disconnected to submit an application by email and we try to assist these as quickly as we can to restore their service. We believe these steps help to ensure the most vulnerable in our community receive timely and meaningful assistance.
